ITEMS NOT ALLOWED

- Lighters/Candles/Open Flames of Any Kind
- Rice
- Toast/Hot Dogs/Prunes
- Water Pistols

Props in our Prop Bag: When and How to Use Them

Prop bags are available for sale to help with audience participation. Bags are available online for \$6 or at the box office for \$8. Supplies are limited, so online purchases are encouraged. Here are the items in the prop bag and a little guidance on when and how to use them:

Newspaper:

When Brad and Janet are caught in the storm, Janet covers her head with a newspaper. Do the same with yours!

Sponge:

When Columbia is doing her "bitch out" speech and says to Frank, "you're like a sponge!" Throw the sponge!

• Rubber Glove:

During Frank's speech at the tank, when he puts on the gloves, stretch and snap your gloves

• Party Hat: At the dinner table, when Frank puts on a party hat, you should do the same.

Noisemaker

During the "Lab" scene, when the Transylvanian guests use their noisemakers.

Glow Stick

Light up the place during the "There's a light" verse of "Over at the Frankenstein Place"

Confetti

At the end of the "Charles Atlas Song" reprise, the Transylvanians throw confetti as Rocky and Frank head toward the bedroom. You should do the same. Do the same during the wedding scene.

Toilet Paper

When Dr. Scott enters the lab, Brad cries out "Great Scott!" At this point, Hurl rolls of toilet paper into the air.
